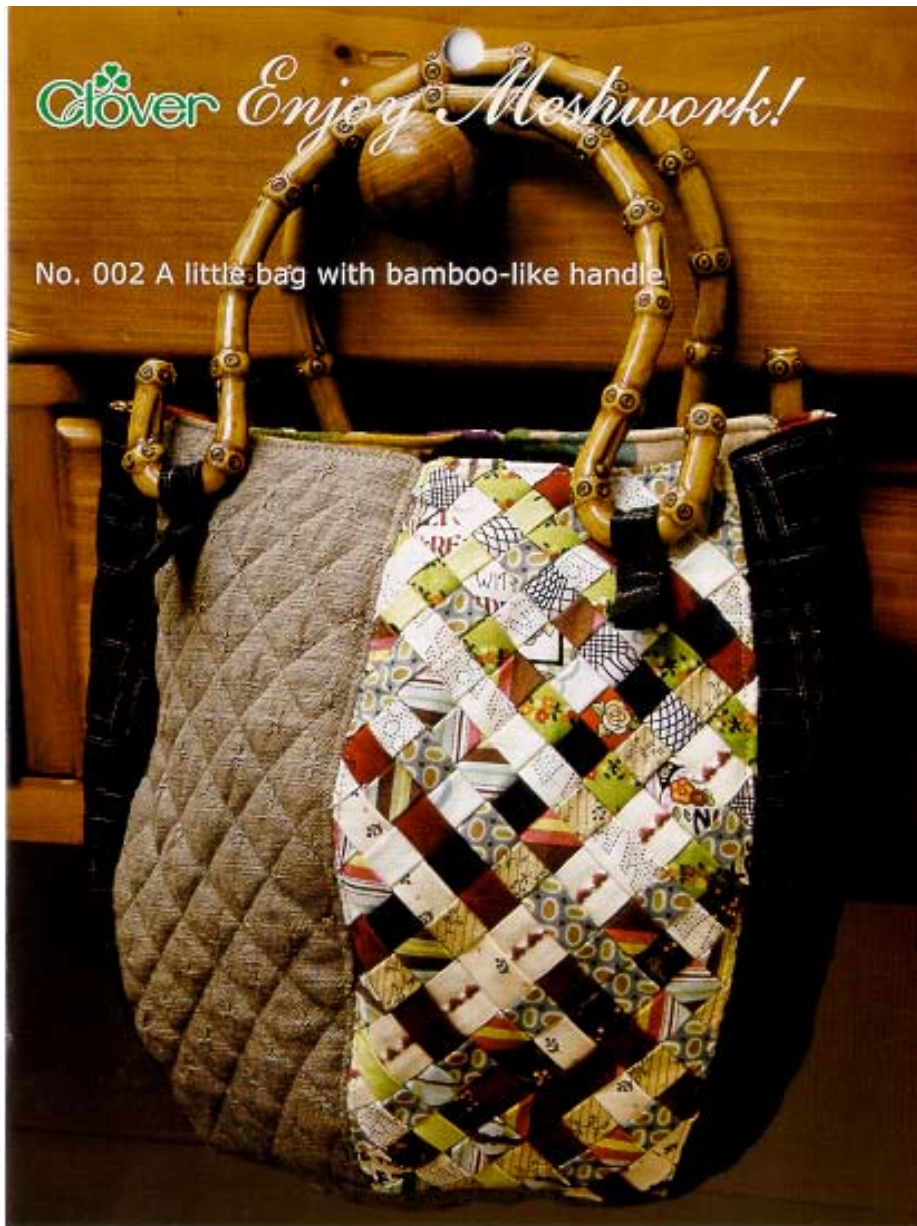


Clover *Enjoy Meshwork!*

No. 002 A little bag with bamboo-like handle



Make this little bag by weaving your favorite fabric bias strips using fusible web and coordinating quilted fabric. The project requires only simple weaving techniques. The placement and repeat of several colors of fabric strips will create a fantastic result. Clover's useful tools for making fusible web bias strips will make this a quick and enjoyable project.

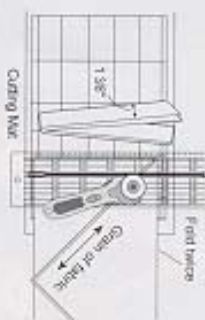
HOW TO MAKE

1. Prepare sufficient fusible bias tapes for the project. The width of fabric should be 1". And use the 1/2" Fusible Bias Tape Maker to make fusible bias tape. The sample project is mixed with 3/4" Fusible Tape Maker (The width of fabric should be 1 3/8").

In case of weaving only 1/2" bias tapes: 56 pieces 1/2" width 14 1/2" long

How to make a Fusible Web

① Fold the fabric twice and cut it the needed width with a Rotary Cutter.



② Place the Fusible Web in the upper groove of the Fusible Bias Tape Maker, the strip in the lower groove.



③ Hold ends of fusible web and strip in place on the ironing board with a pin and press the Fusible Web with an iron while pulling both tapes through the Tape Maker.



④ Peel off protective paper after the tape cools. Make required lengths of tape for colors A, B and C respectively.

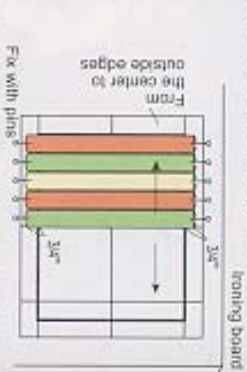


How to make a basic weave.

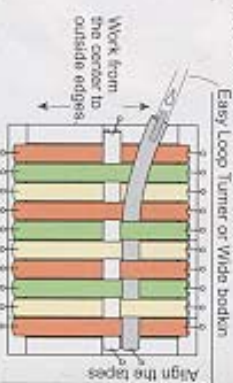
1. Draw guidelines crossing at right angles on base fabric with a Water Soluble Marker.



2. Place the base fabric on the ironing board and arrange tapes vertically from center to outside. Fix the tapes so that the upper and lower ends extend 3/4" beyond the finished edge lines. Do not stretch the tapes.



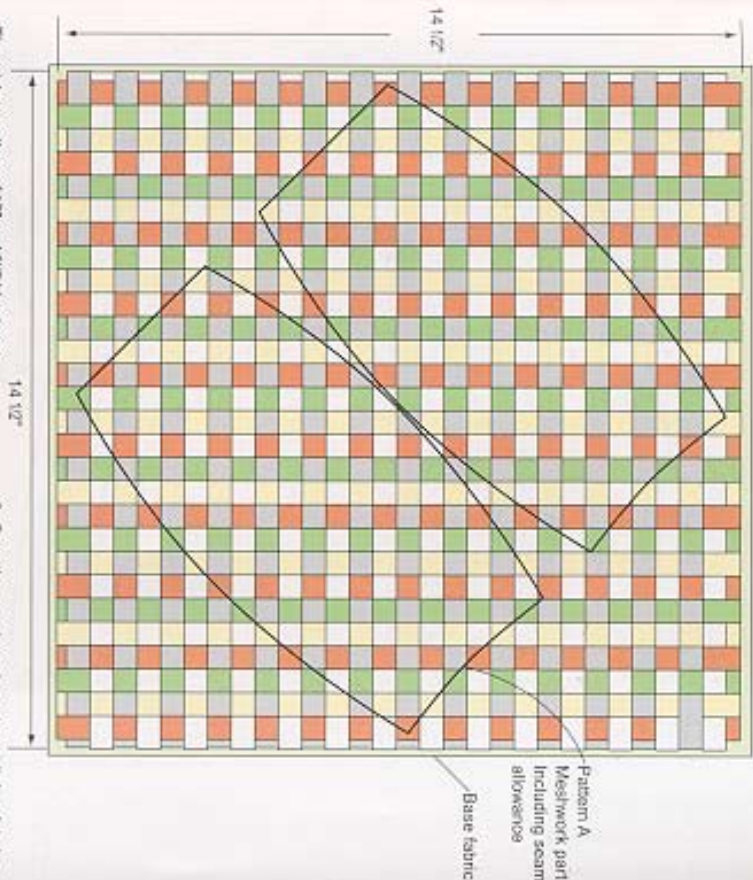
3. Pass the first tape alternately over and under the vertical tapes with an Easy Loop Turner. Weave the rest of the tapes to make a checkered pattern.



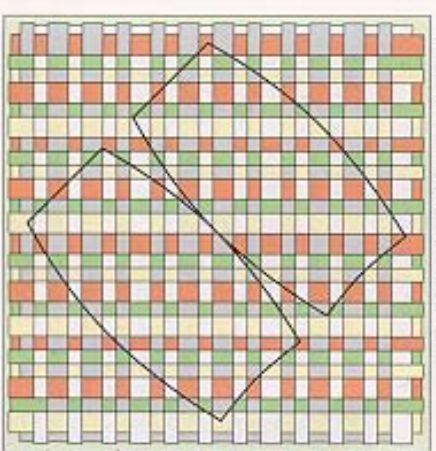
4. Gently arrange the vertical and horizontal tapes at right angles, and fix them to the base fabric with an iron. Then sew along the edges with a sewing machine.



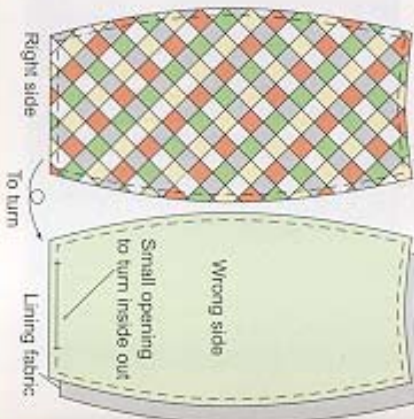
2. Weave the 2 meshwork panels of main sides with your favorite pattern combination. Place the patterns in a direction of 45 degree. When finished weaving, gently iron on the surface. Cut along the pattern line.



<The mature pattern of 1/2" and 3/4" bias tapes>



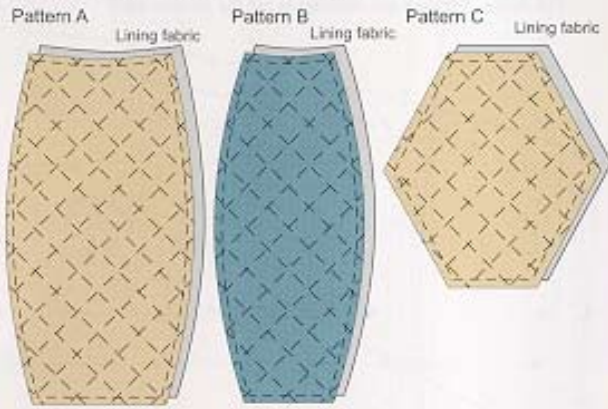
3. Sew the meshwork part and lining fabrics right side together. Then turn inside out through opening left at bottom.



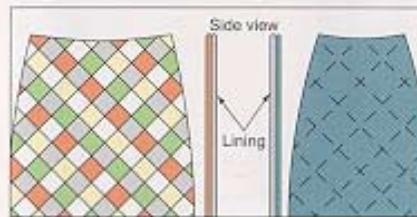
4. Stitch from the reverse side leaving the small space for the opening. When finished, turn inside out. Stitch the opening part shut.



5. Make the quilted fabrics and cut the parts following the patterns. Sew together with liner fabrics as same as the meshwork parts.



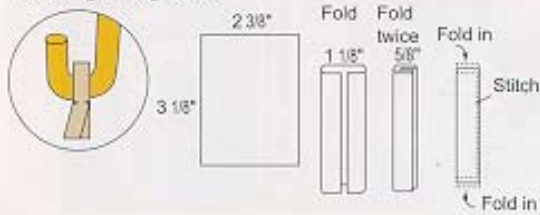
6. Stitch together each part one by one. First, stitch together the lining fabrics and next stitch right side fabrics as shown.



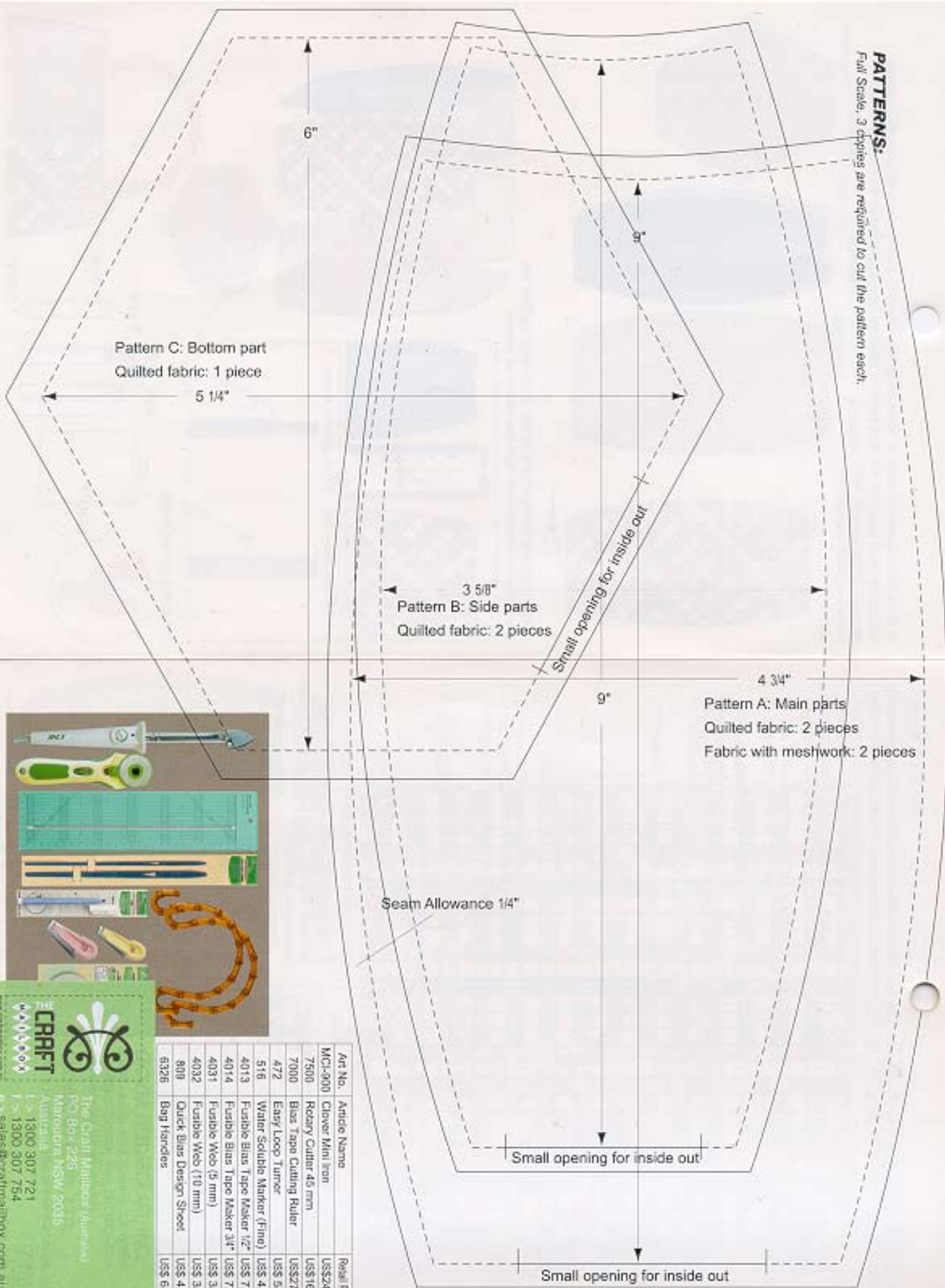
(1) The lining side is first. (2) The right side is next

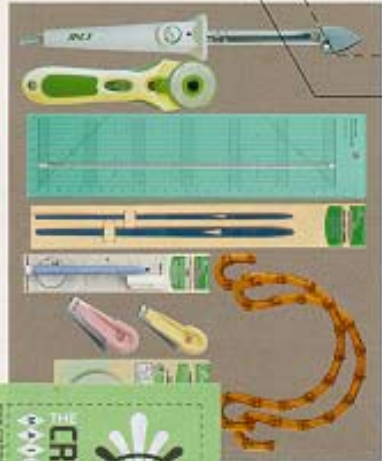
